

How many treatments will I need?

Production of new collagen is a natural process occurring over a period of time, so improvement of your skin's appearance will be gradual and become noticeable after two or three months. In some occasions, more than one laser session may be needed to obtain the desired result. These additional sessions may be scheduled in two or four-week intervals. To maintain long-lasting improvement, follow-up care may include annual maintenance sessions.

What should I expect after treatment?

There is virtually no downtime and you may resume normal activity immediately. Light makeup can be applied following the procedure, and your skin will be firmer, smoother and more radiant.

Laser Skin Resurfacing

What causes wrinkles in the skin? Sun damage, strong facial expression use, and the normal aging process significantly contribute to the changes we associate with

growing older. In that process, there is a gradual increase in surface wrinkles associated with the elasticity loss coupled with repetitive use of muscle of facial expressions (example: frowning, crows feet, lines around the mouth, neck folds and wrinkles, hand wrinkles, etc).

What is laser skin resurfacing?

Laser skin resurfacing is a new treatment for wrinkles and uneven pigmentation. This gentle process with minimal discomfort gradually reduces skin blemishes, giving your skin a younger and fresher look.

How does it work?

Using the laser, the upper layers of skin are gently removed. As the laser safely penetrates deeper layers of skin, unnecessary pigments in the skin are targeted and broken down. Deeper yet, the laser stimulates the production of new collagen fibers. This new collagen us tighter, giving your skin a younger, fresher look.

What areas of the skin can be treated with this procedure?

All age-sensitive areas can be treated including the face, around the eyes and mouth, the chin, neck, chest and hands.

What skin types can be treated?

The laser can be used safely and effectively on all skin types, even tanned skin.

What happen during the procedure?

You will wear safety eyewear to protect your eyes from the laser light. Your provider will apply a small wand-like device to the skin to deliver the laser pulse.

Does it hurt?

Some patients report mild discomfort associated with the laser pulses. The feeling has been described as a pinprick for a fraction of a second. A cooling plate on the hand piece helps to diminish this discomfort. On some occasions, your provider may apply a

topical to your skin prior to the laser treatment to help cool and numb the skin.

Is the procedure safe?

There are no risks and no side effects with the laser. More aggressive treatments, however, might induce some temporary discoloration or reddening of the skin. If this occurs, the skin will typically return to normal pigmentation in a short period of time.

How long will the procedure take?

The procedure can take anywhere from a few minutes to a half-hour, depending on the size of the treatment area.
